From the Principal's Desk

Dear Parents

It has been lovely to hear about the ways some of our families have celebrated the Lunar New Year and the Year of the Horse. Families have come together to share food, embrace traditions, exchange wishes for good fortune and celebrate a new beginning.

This afternoon on Friday 20 February from 4:30pm the P&C Sundowner. It's a picnic on the school grounds as the sun is going down. Families gather on the black court, listen to music provided by parent band and children play with friends. Don't be shy, please come along and share in the Mt Claremont spirit of community. Thank you to the year 6s for setting up the equipment!

Basketball Court Upgrade

The court has been transformed into a construction site. Staff and students are captivated by the work of the vehicles demolishing the court. Contractors have made a road, found and even older old court underneath the old court, and located old soak wells and pipes.

The school's health and safety representatives and the Programmed management team are working to manage the dust outside the classrooms.

- Air filters are in rooms closest to the project.
- School bags will be located inside classrooms.
- Students will only be on the veranda on entry and exit to the classroom.
- Wipe feet on entry to classrooms
- Site is watered.
- Shade cloth on the metal fence has been installed
- Cleaning of outdoor areas
- Outdoor learning moved to the decking with picnic tables.
- No construction noise during NAPLAN testing periods, assemblies etc.

I am working the Department to Education to manage the asphalt phase of construction and what that may look like for the school. The health and safety of staff and students is our priority.

School Board

The Mount Claremont Primary School Board provides additional expertise to assist the school to achieve the best outcomes for students. Its primary role is in contributing to the establishment and review of the school's objectives, priorities and general policy direction.

The current School Board consists of four parents: Kate Oosterhoff, Libby Goodwin, Andrew Lillico, x 1 TBC, two staff Libby Johnson, Michelle La Freniere and the Principal as ex-officio.

As part of the cyclic process of a School Board, places become available due to either the end of their tenure or members are unable to complete their tenure. At this point in time, Mount Claremont Primary School Board is calling for one (1) parent to fill a 3 year position. Becoming a parent representative on the Board provides a great opportunity to get involved in our school community and therefore the education of your child.

Tenure

Parent Representative position – period of three (3) years, finishing Term 2 2028.

Role of a school Board

All Public Schools in Western Australia have a School Board. An unincorporated Board uses approved terms of reference to define its way of working and to meet the requirements of the legislation.

1. A mandated elected Parent category. More than one third of the total members must be from this category.
2. A mandated elected Department of Education employee category. Members of this category may makeup no more than one third of the total membership of school Board.
3. An optional Community Member category. Its members are appointed by a decision of the Board because of their special skills, interests or experiences.

The school Board must comprise a collective majority of either parent and/or community members.

How to become involved

Parents on a school board provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school.

The most obvious way is to vote in the elections, which are held on a cyclic basis as determined by the Terms of Reference.

Ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant. In view of this, you might seriously consider standing for election as a member of the school board or encouraging another person to stand for election. No special experience is needed to be on a school board. What you do need is an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

How to nominate

Department of Education employees who have a child enrolled in a school in which they are not employed are eligible to nominate as parents for the school board. Once the nomination form is completed, return it to the school administration within the time stated on the notice of election. You will receive a nomination form receipt. If there are more nominations received than there are vacancies on the school board, a ballot will be conducted during the weeks after the call for nominations has closed.

On Monday 23 February a school board nomination message and form will be sent to parents via Compass. In the nomination form provide a brief outline of your experience or skills you would bring to the board. If nominees go to a ballot, your photo and this candidate profile will be published on our school website for the community to view.

Frequency of Meetings

A minimum of six (6) meetings must be held annually, with 8 meetings normally planned throughout the calendar year. Meetings are usually held on Wednesdays in weeks 3 and 8 of each school term, commencing at 5:00pm. The day and time of Board meetings is reviewed annually.

 You cannot volunteer	When you: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• have a current Interim Negative Notice or Negative Notice• have submitted the form and are issued an Interim Negative Notice or Negative Notice – you must alert the principal.
In addition to the declaration form, you need a Working with Children (WWC) Check	
 You need a WWC Check	When you: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• volunteer for an overnight camp• billet students in your home• provide one-on-one mentoring to a student.

We thank all our parents who generously volunteer their time and energy to support our school community. There are some changes to the Working with Children Check policy, to ensure the safety of children when we have volunteers in the school.

If you would like to volunteer at our school, you will need to sign a 'Parent and child volunteer declaration form'. You cannot volunteer if you have a current Working with Children Negative Notice or Interim Negative Notice.

These changes affect parents who are engaged in volunteer work. For example, you are considered a volunteer when you assist with activities such as reading sessions, day excursions, canteen duties, helping at a sports carnival or carrying out P&C duties.

You are not a volunteer when:

- picking up and dropping off your child
- observing events like school assemblies
- attending parent and teacher interviews
- visiting the uniform shop.

If your circumstances change, and you are issued with a Negative Notice or Interim Negative Notice after completing the 'Parent and child volunteer declaration form', you must advise the principal. A current Working with Children Check is required by all other family members and friends over 18 years of age who want to volunteer. It is a collective responsibility to ensure the safety of our children. We appreciate your ongoing support and dedication to our school community. Checks for parent volunteers in schools.

We are grateful for and value our parent volunteers – here's how you can help keep our children safe when doing unpaid work at your child's school. Before you volunteer at your

child's school, you need to complete a Parent and child volunteer declaration form. You will be asked to complete the form annually if you want to continue volunteering.

Therapy and Tutoring During School Hours

The Department of Education understands that parents may engage external service providers to deliver services for their children when they require additional health, disability and wellbeing support. In some circumstances, it may be appropriate for the services to be delivered at school to ensure their child receives the best support and can participate fully in school.

We have developed a new partnership with SchoolTherapy, an online service designed to simplify how we manage in-school therapy appointments and tutoring during school hours. This new system replaces the old process of exchanging paperwork and chasing signatures with a streamlined, secure, and simplified process.

Process:

For any student having therapy & tutoring (during school hours onsite or offsite) or visiting psychologists you will need to notify me directly by emailing me

elizabeth.johnson@education.wa.edu.au advising that a therapist/tutor/psychologist is requesting to work with your child. Once I have the details of the therapist they will be entered on the system, the therapist will then receive a link and will be able to upload all their documentation for checking. Once all the documentation is uploaded and checked the program can commence. How does this benefit you?

- **No More Paperwork:** You will no longer need to print, sign, and scan documents. With SchoolTherapy, all necessary forms are completed by the therapist and the school. You will be sent a couple of emails containing a secure link for you to sign any documentation. A copy of any documents you have signed will be automatically emailed to you for your records.

- **Convenient Appointments:** The system is designed to make scheduling easy. When a therapist books a session for your child, you will be notified and given the option to reject the proposed appointment if it doesn't work for your family.
- **Stay Informed:** If a booking is ever created, cancelled or rescheduled, you will receive an immediate email notification, so you're always kept in the loop.

- **Your Privacy is Protected:** SchoolTherapy prioritizes security and privacy. All documents and personal information are stored on a secure, cloud-based platform, ensuring your data is protected and handled with the highest level of care. We are committed to making in-school therapy as accessible and smooth as possible for all our students. This new system is a leap forward in efficiency and security, allowing everyone involved—parents, therapists,

and school staff—to focus on what truly matters: supporting our children. If you have any questions as we make this transition, please me:

All communication, attendance, school calendar and excursion/events notes will be through **Compass**. You will need to download the **Compass App**; the portal is accessible via the web and also via the Compass School Manager app. Once the app has been installed and opened for the first time, you will be prompted to choose which school your child attends. After selecting the school, you will be required to enter your login details which are the same details you use to login to your Compass parent portal. Within the parent portal you can add attendance notes, consent for school events and view school news items.

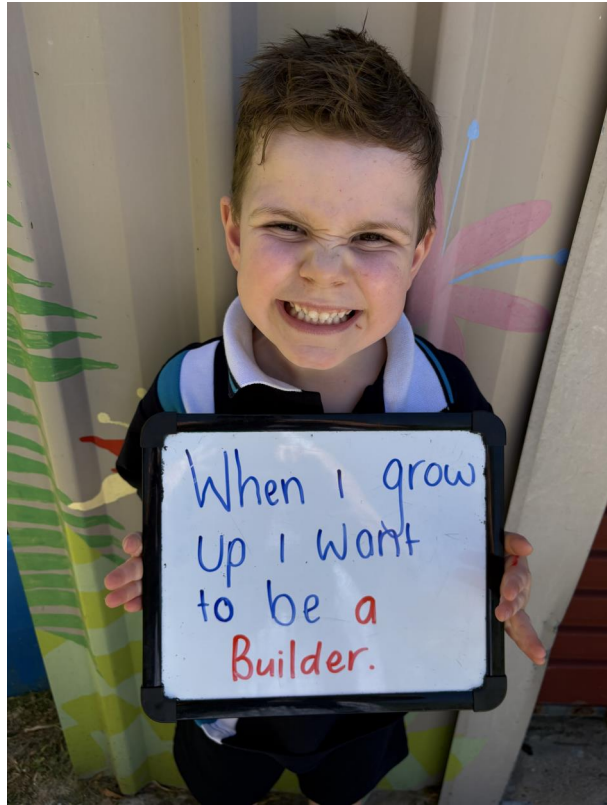
We also visited the library for the very first time and this week the children learned their first Peggy Lego pre-writing pattern called "Tall Man".

We kicked off in week 2, and it was heaps of fun! We hope to see some of our quieter children join us, turning the library into an explorative space for curiosity, friendship-building across ages, and skill development—though skill-building is not the primary objective, this time also allows for quiet reflection.

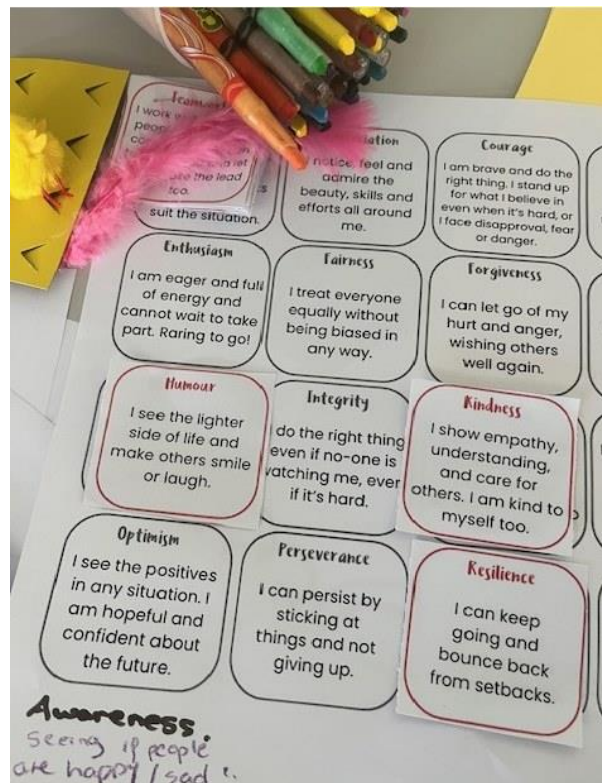
Ms. Dalton will supervise the space and will always have a wellbeing activity ready, whether it's reading the "feelings" books, engaging with an activity from the Friendology journal, or, as we did this week, playing a definitions game focused on recognising our strengths and those of each other.

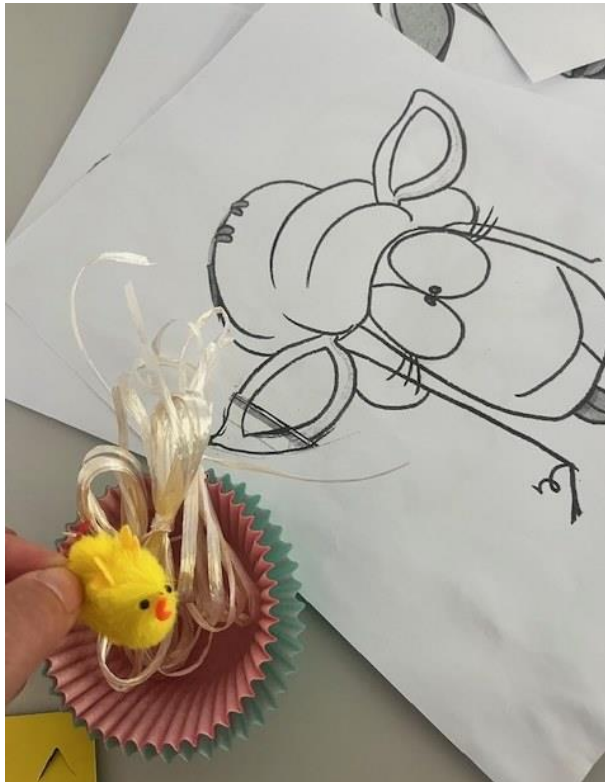
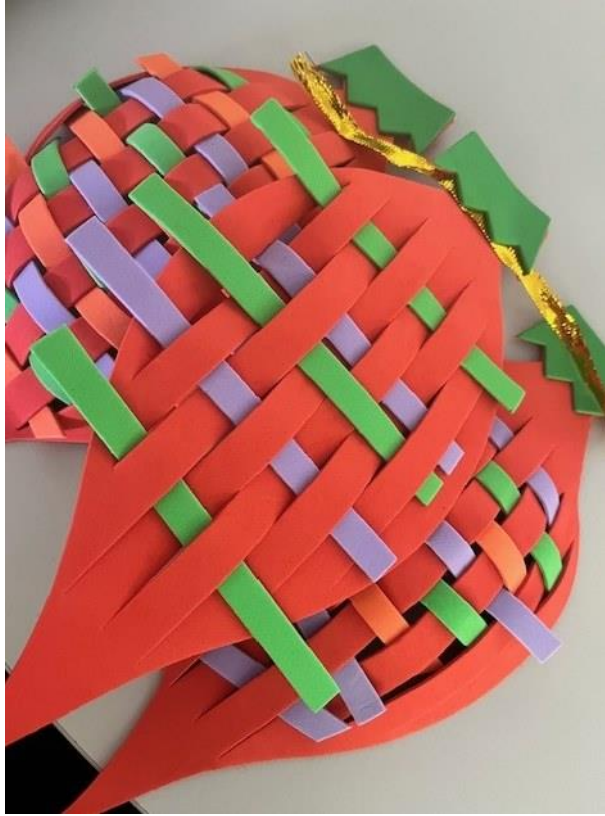
Additionally, this is a wonderful opportunity for one child to coach and mentor another. For example, Eito and Hudson taught a friend how to make origami, which happened organically with a few bits of paper left on the table. This created a cultural sharing opportunity for Eito and a rewarding learning experience for the child being taught, all led by our older year six child as a leader.

Each week, the activity tables will change based on what is needed. This week, we made nests for little chicks, had chess available, displayed the lifecycle of a frog with real specimens (along with a book to explain it), offered LEGO for creative play, and our Year 6 Defense Mentors read a book on the big cushions to an injured child who didn't want to play outside anymore.

The following week, as well as above we collaborate to create lanterns in celebration of Chinese New Year.

We look forward to seeing all the children in the library for connection, reflection and unstructured time to chill, yet the possibility to engage if they wish.
