## From the Principal's Desk

Dear Parents,

You are expected to drive very slowly and safely when using the Alfred Road entrance, exits and parking. Take extreme care and be vigilant when parking, reversing, driving and loading/unloading children from the vehicle. Unfortunately, there have been some incidents which could have caused serious injury to a child. None of us could live that, or the

consequence of committing a criminal offence. Children are impulsive, and they rely on responsible adults to keep them safe.

The school rules

- Drive carefully and slowly.
- Look, and look again when parking and reversing.
- Keep children close by your side.
- Do not park and hold up traffic on the "kiss and drive road".
- If your child is not at the "pick up spot" you must drive on and do a lap.
- Exit and turn LEFT to keep the traffic flow moving.
- In peak times don't turn RIGHT because you hold up the traffic and stop the flow.
- Be a courteous and considerate driver.

Consider walking, riding, scooting to school or parking further away and walking a short distance to your vehicle. Please inform your carers, nannies and au pairs of the rules. Let's keep everyone safe.

## **School Board - parent vacancy to fill**

### **School Board - Parent Representative needed starting term 3.**

The Mount Claremont Primary School Board provides additional expertise to assist the school to achieve the best outcomes for students. Its primary role is in contributing to the establishment and review of the school's objectives, priorities and general policy direction.

The current School Board consists of four parents: Kate Oosterhoff, Libby Goodwin, Andrew Lillico, Kristian Warr, two staff Libby Johnson, Michelle La Freniere and the Principal as ex-officio.

As part of the cyclic process of a School Board, places become available due to either the end of their tenure or members are unable to complete their tenure. At this point in time, Mount Claremont Primary School Board is calling for one (1) parent to fill a 3 year position. Becoming a parent representative on the Board provides a great opportunity to get involved in our school community and therefore the education of your child.

### **Tenure**

Parent Representative position – period of three (3) years, starting term 3 2026 to term 3 - 2028

### **Role of a school Board**

All Public Schools in Western Australia have a School Board. An unincorporated Board uses approved terms of reference to define its way of working and to meet the requirements of the legislation.

1. A mandated elected Parent category. More than one third of the total members must be from this category.

2. A mandated elected Department of Education employee category. Members of this category may make up no more than one third of the total membership of school Board.

3. An optional Community Member category. Its members are appointed by a decision of the Board because of their special skills, interests or experiences.

The school Board must comprise a collective majority of either parent and/or community members.

### **How to become involved**

Parents on a school board provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school. The most obvious way is to vote in the elections, which are held on a cyclic basis as determined by the Terms of Reference. Ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant. In view of this, you might seriously consider standing for election as a member of the school board or encouraging another person to stand for election. No special experience is needed to be on a school board. What you do need is an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

### **How to nominate -**

Department of Education employees who have a child enrolled in a school in which they are not employed are eligible to nominate as parents for the school board. Once the nomination form is completed, return it to the school administration within the time stated on the notice of election. You will receive a nomination form receipt. If there are more nominations received than there are vacancies on the school board, a ballot will be conducted during the weeks after the call for nominations has closed.

In the nomination form provide a brief outline of your experience or skills you would bring to the board. If nominees go to a ballot, your photo and this candidate profile will be published on our school website for the community to view.

### **Frequency of Meetings**

A minimum of six (6) meetings must be held annually, with 8 meetings normally planned throughout the calendar year. Meetings are usually held on Wednesdays in weeks 3 and 8 of each school term, commencing at 5:00pm.

## Important Reminders from Administration



### **Sign In and Out on Passtab**

If your child arrives at school after the school bell has sounded, a parent or guardian must sign the child in to school via passtab. The teacher marks the roll when the bell sounds, and it cannot be changed. If you do not sign in after the bell, you will receive a message stating your child is not at school.

If your child is leaving the school during the school day, a parent/guardian must sign them out at the office.

Please include a reason for signing in or out. If there is no reason the child will have an unexplained absence on their attendance record.

In the event of an emergency the school must have accurate attendance records to keep your children safe. Please help us by signing in or out your child as required.

### **Family Court Parental Orders**

If your child's care is covered by Family Court parenting orders, please ensure the school has the most recent copy of your parenting orders for our records to ensure the safety of your child.

## Allergy Aware = Safe School

We are asking your help to support the children in our school who are at risk of anaphylaxis.

Anaphylaxis is a severe allergic reaction that is potentially life threatening.

Food allergies are the most common cause of anaphylaxis. There is no cure for food allergy, therefore avoidance of known food allergens is crucial. Peanuts and tree nuts are the foods most likely to cause anaphylaxis.

The school is supporting children at risk of anaphylaxis by:

- training staff
- encouraging children to wash their hands after eating
- educating children about food allergies
- choosing not to sell foods in the school canteen which have peanuts or tree nuts for example hazelnuts, cashews, almonds in the main ingredients list.

We ask you to support children at risk of anaphylaxis by:

- **not sending food which has peanuts or tree nuts** for example hazelnuts, cashews, almonds in the main ingredients list. Note: products containing traces of peanuts or tree nuts can be sent to school
- teaching your child not to share food with friends that have food allergy
- encouraging your child to wash their hands after eating
- asking your child to get help immediately if their allergic schoolmate gets sick
- explaining to your child that teasing a child with an allergy or tampering with their medication, is bullying and could be life-threatening. With your help we can provide a safe environment that meets the needs of all our children.

When doing your child's enrolment there will be some information and documents that you will need on hand to complete the process.

**These include**

- 1 Centrelink CRNs for yourself and the child you are enrolling
- 2 Credit card or bank account details for direct debit purposes
- 3 Emergency contact details in case you are not contactable in an emergency
- 4 Authorised nominees for drop off and collection
- 5 Doctor, Medicare, immunisations details for your child
- 6 Any medical or health details for your child

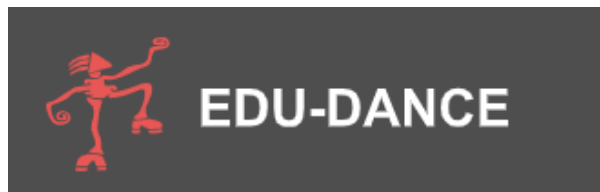

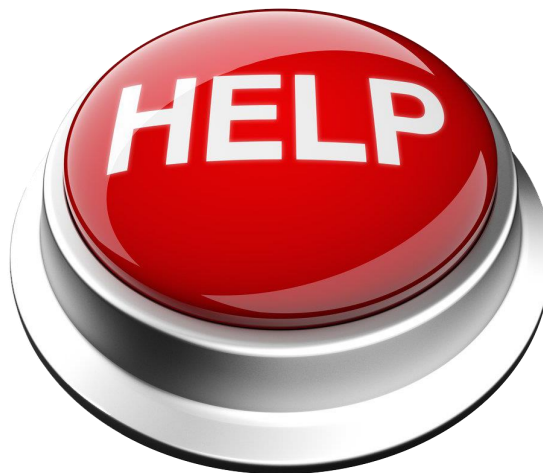

## Student Reports and NAPLAN



Our administration regularly receives requests from families wanting copies of school reports, NAPLAN results and other documentation. While we are happy to assist where possible, fulfilling these requests is time consuming and can be avoided.

To help streamline this approach we ask that all families set up a file (digital and or hard copy) for each child.

Please ensure you:

- Download and save a copy of **NAPLAN results**
- Download and save a copy of **school reports each semester**
- Keep **hard copies** where possible

These documents are often required for **high school enrolments, new school enrolments, and scholarship applications**.

Please note that **report links expire**. Once you receive your child's report, it is essential that you **download and save a copy immediately** for your records, as access cannot be guaranteed at a later date.

Thank you for your support in helping us manage this process efficiently.

## **Kindergarten Enrolments 2027 are now open!**

All children born between 1 July 2022 and 30 June 2023 are eligible to start Kindy in 2027.

Applications for Enrolment forms are available on the MCPS website or from the Office. We would appreciate it if you could complete your application forms as soon as possible.

Closing date for enrolments is 24 July 2026.

## **Therapy and Tutoring at school**

The Department of Education understands that parents may engage external service providers to deliver services for their children when they require additional health, disability and wellbeing support. In some circumstances, it may be appropriate for the services to be delivered at school to ensure their child receives the best support and can participate fully in school. We have developed a new partnership with SchoolTherapy, an online service designed to simplify how we manage in-school therapy appointments. This new system replaces the old process of exchanging paperwork and chasing signatures with a streamlined, secure, and simplified process.

To commence this process, you will need to email me directly [elizabeth.johnson@education.wa.edu.au](mailto:elizabeth.johnson@education.wa.edu.au), advising that a therapist/tutor is requesting to work with your child. Once I have the details of the therapist they will be entered in the system, the therapist will then receive a link and will be able to upload all their documentation for checking. Once all the documentation is uploaded and checked the program can commence.
