From the Principal's Desk

Dear parents,

There have been changes to end-of-semester reporting for Pre-primary to Year 10 students. These changes are now in effect, as you will see in the Semester 1 reports at the end of Term 2. The Department of Education has introduced consistent reporting requirements for all schools. These changes are designed to make reports meaningful and easier to understand and consistent across all public schools.

End of semester reports will continue to highlight your child's strengths and achievements. They will include a clear summary of your child's learning;

The Pre-primary to Year 2 report will provide:

- an achievement descriptor for each learning area studied
- information on your child's personal and social learning, and their attitude, behaviour and effort
- an overall teacher comment about your child's progress and achievement, including English and mathematics.

Years 3 to 6 reports will provide:

- a grade for each learning area studied
- information on your child's attitude, behaviour and effort
- an overall teacher comment about your child's progress and achievement, including English and mathematics.

Special education needs

Reporting on a student's progress and achievement in terms of year-level achievement standards is not required for students with disability requiring an alternative curriculum and significant learning adjustments.

- reporting on individual learning area goals
- a school-developed achievement descriptor for each set of learning area goals
- information on the student's personal development and learning behaviour

English as an additional language or dialect (EALD)

Reporting on a student's progress and achievement in terms of year-level achievement standards is not required for students whom English is an additional language or dialect (first and second year in Australia). Students who are not proficient in Australian Standard English may receive an EALD report for the English learning area.

Kindergarten Report

Reporting of students' achievement in learning outcomes from the Early Years Learning Framework (EYLF) and Kindergarten Curriculum Guidelines and includes a teacher comment.

Student Reports will be sent electronically to parents on Monday 29 June.

I have some updates in regard to the times of the Workshop, Tech Rehearsal and Concert, as well as our uniform and instrument requirements. Can you please also make sure you completed OPUS's online Permission Form sent via Compass previously.

Students SHOULD NOT bring phones or devices with them. Please ensure ALL their belongings are labelled (instruments, waterbottles, bags, hats etc)

Guitarists - We have decided we want students to use their own classical guitars for this performance rather than the school's electric guitars. It will make setting up easier and the band look more uniform. So, for the workshop, tech rehearsal and concert, **guitarists need to bring their own classical guitar.**

Workshop Tuesday June 9 - student will need to wear school uniform and bring all their instrument requirements, music folder, recess, lunch and water bottle, hat and bag, pencil and eraser.

Tech Rehearsal Monday June 29 - student will need to wear school uniform and bring all their instrument requirements, music folder, recess, lunch and waterbottle, hat and bag, pencil and eraser. **Student will need to be at school at 7:55am** to leave at 8:10am. If you do not have these please ask others in the school community if you can borrow, lots of choir students should have black pants and shoes. Jeans are fine but no leggings please. The school has spare shoes if needed but might be too small for larger feet. No large bows or

head pieces, jewellery or items of clothing that may draw attention please. School coloured headbands or lackeys would be preferred.

Students need to arrive at Perth Modern (dropoff location TBC) between 5:15pm and 5:30pm.

Concert doors are 6:30 for a 7pm start, ticket info and Parking info was sent in previous Compass notices.

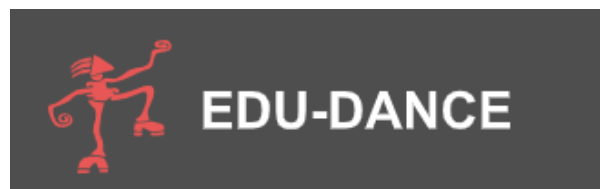

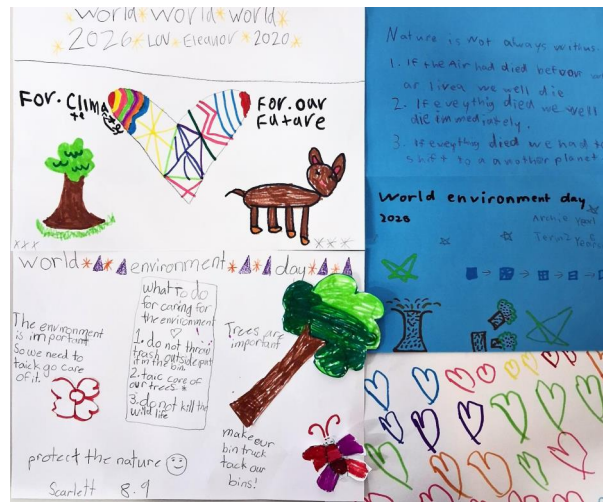
